	Contributing to designing data collection strategies (including developing surveys, selecting appropriate outcomes measures);





	Cofacilitation of focus groups; Data administration and management (this may include safe handling of collected data that complies with safety privacy and ethical guidelines); Assistance with analysing and presenting research findings, including co-creation of interactive reports/research dissemination tools; and Support with tender writing. General organisational tasks may include: Participate in relevant team meetings; Comply with drummond street policy and procedures; Participate in regular supervision and performance development activities.
Role expectations	At CFRE you will be working in a multidisciplinary team that is highly collaborative and prides itself on high quality work. Therefore, the successful candidate will be enthusiastic, flexible, a good communicator and keen to contribute to the team.
